
The Armathwaite Amble

A very easy stroll around the woodlands in the grounds of the hotel. Less than half a mile long with clear, easy pathways & space to unwind.

A perfect evening stroll either before or after dinner depending on the season.



Walk Route

From the main entrance to the hotel turn left and head around the back of the hotel towards the lake.

At the top of the stone steps turn right towards the woodland, then take the path that forks to the left. (Point A)

Follow the path as it winds down through the woodland. When you reach the large covered bench seat under the shooting tower at the far end of the walk (you can make a detour through the wooden gate and down to 2 small ponds.) (Point B)

Returning to the main path, bear left and follow the path as it rises gently.

After passing through an open grassy space continue through the natural archway and return to the main hotel lawns. (Point A).


DID YOU KNOW ...

- 1. During World War 2 Hunmanby Girl's School was evacuated to the hotel and the girls often climbed through the Lake Room window and sneaked down to the lake when they should have been studying!
- 2. There has been a house on this site since the 11th century though reliable records can only be traced back to 1548 when it belonged to Allan, Second Lord of Allerdale
- 3. Did you know? The hall was bought in 1930 for £5000 & converted into a hotel. At that time a double room with ensuite cost "from 25 shillings per night" (around £1.50)
- 4. The current owners, the Graves family, bought the hall in 1976 & developed into the beautiful building you see today.
